October 5, 2020 City Council Minutes 213 1st Street NW Mount Vernon, Iowa 52314

The Mount Vernon City Council met October 5, 2020 at the Mount Vernon City Council Chambers with the following members present: Roudabush, West, Wieseler, Herrmann and Rose.

Call to Order. At 6:30 p.m. Mayor Jamie Hampton called the meeting to order and reminded all guests in attendance that masks are required in public buildings unless a six foot separation can be maintained.

Agenda Additions/Agenda Approval. Discussion item #2 (LBC Day Camp Report) will be tabled. Motion made by Wieseler, seconded by West to approve agenda as amended. Carried all.

Consent Agenda. Motion made by West, seconded by Herrmann to approve Consent Agenda. Carried all. Approval of City Council Minutes – September 21, 2020 Regular Council Meeting Approval of Liquor License – Mt. Vernon Pizza Palace, LLC Appoint Matt Nelson and Emily Zimmon – Housing Commission

Public Hearing

Public Hearing for the Amendment to the Comprehensive Plan and Land Use Map for the Creation of the Hwy 30 Bypass Overlay District (to remain tabled until October 19, 2020). Close public hearing – Proceed to G-1

Ordinance Approval/Amendment

Ordinance #8-17-2020A: Amending Chapter 135 Street Use and Maintenance of the Mount Vernon Municipal Code. Motion to approve the third and final reading. Staff has not received any written or verbal communication on this ordinance since the first reading. Motion to approve the third reading of Ordinance #8-17-2020A made by Wieseler, seconded by Rose. Roll call all yes. Ordinance passes the third and final reading.

Ordinance #9-8-2020A: Amending Chapter 15 Mayor of the Mount Vernon Municipal Code. Motion to approve the third and final reading. Staff has not received any written or verbal communication on this ordinance since the first reading. Motion to approve the third reading of Ordinance #9-8-2020A made by Rose, seconded by West. Roll call all yes. Ordinance passes the third and final reading.

Ordinance #9-8-2020B: Adopting Chapter 49 Mandating Face Coverings During Public Health Emergencies of the Mount Vernon Municipal Code. Motion to approve the third and final reading. Keith Huebner stated that the Mayor had been served with a lawsuit prior to tonight's meeting and he urged Council not to proceed with the third reading and rescind the actual mask mandate. Jerry Niederhauser said he has had COVID in his family and knows people who have died from it but in his opinion this is a gross overreaction. He also said the number of people dying from it are way down and is a very low percentage and he does not want to be part of a "one world government". Shannon Thompson, an attorney representing Hunter Parks, said this is not about masks or the ethacacy of masks or whether or not we wear them, the issue is that it is illegal for the City Council to pass this ordinance because only the governor is able to institute a mask ordinance. She is asking that Council reconsider this again. Siobhan Briley, also representing Hunter Parks, Keith Huebner and Global Water Services, LLC (plaintiffs in the lawsuit filed) said her personal beliefs are that everyone should wear masks but said our personal beliefs should not guide whether municipal bodies can require citizens and visitors to wear masks. She is convinced that the legal position in the papers served tonight is correct. She is urging Council to reconsider

this ordinance. Briley summarized the documents served tonight by saying that they are a petition for a declaratory judgement and injunctive relief by asking the court to determine that the City Council does not have the authority to issue a mandate requiring persons within the City to wear masks under the circumstances stated. It also includes an application for a temporary injunction while proceedings are pending. This is based on an analysis of the Iowa Constitution and the Iowa Code governing the authority to respond to a State Public Health Disaster Emergency. Only the governor has the authority to direct citizens of the State of Iowa to do certain things or refrain from certain things in the situation where there is a Public Health Disaster Emergency. The information in the Code interpreted by case law says that cities are exceeding their home rule authority when they take actions, such as requiring citizens in the city to wear masks. She ended by saying it is her belief that if Council proceeds to the third reading and passes the ordinance, there will be litigation, which will have financial consequences to the City. It was the consensus of Council members that the City Attorney should view the legal document presented tonight and get his advice and counsel before proceeding with the third reading. Herrmann made a motion to table the third reading of Ordinance 9-8-2020B, seconded by Rose. Roll call all yes. Ordinance tabled.

Resolutions for Approval

Resolution #9-8-2020D: Amending the Mt. Vernon Comprehensive Plan and Land Use Map for the Creation of the Hwy 30 Bypass Overlay District (to remain tabled until October 19, 2020).

Resolution #10-5-2020A: Approving and Authorizing Execution of a First Amendment to the Agreement for Private Development by and Between the City of Mount Vernon and Midwest Development Co. This amendment would authorize the developer of Spring Meadow Heights to move Phase 3 in front of Phase 2. Having a second entrance to the subdivision from Candlestick Drive would be ideal and staff is recommending approval of this agreement. Motion made by Wieseler, seconded by Roudabush to approve Resolution #10-5-2020A. Roll call all yes. Resolution passes.

Resolution #10-5-2020B: Accepting Work for the Project Known as the Wagon Pass with Schrader Excavating & Grading Company. The project has been completed in accordance with the plans and specifications approved by City Council. Total cost was \$126,269.15. Motion made by Rose, seconded by West to approve Resolution #10-5-2020B. Roll call all yes. Resolution passes.

Discussion and Consideration of Pay Application #1 – South Alley Improvements – Council Action as Needed. Motion made by Rose, seconded by West to approve Pay Application #1 – South Alley Improvements in the amount of \$59,471.71. Carried all.

Discussion and Consideration of Pay Application #3 – Nature Park Trail – Council Action as Needed. Motion made by Wieseler, seconded by Herrmann to approve Pay Application #3 – Nature Park Trail in the amount of \$3,207.25. Carried all.

Possible 28E Agreement for Police Services. Chief Shannon met with Lisbon City Council last week to discuss the proposed 28E agreement for police services and reviewed the proposed contract. The only feedback received from them was trying to come up with some type of cap on the dollar amount or how much of an increase they would see each year from their proposal. Beyond that everything was positive as far as the language in the contract. This agreement would allow for more stable scheduling and provide better resources for both communities.
